} (Rescinding Order 2022-014)

On April 1, 2022, the Arizona Supreme Court issued Administrative Order No. 2022-34 rescinding nearly all the previous pandemic-related administrative orders that have governed the courts in Arizona for the past 25 months and directing, *inter alia*, that all Arizona courts shall resume normal operations. On April 7, 2022, the Superior Court of the State of Arizona In And For The County Of Maricopa issued Administrative Order No. 2022-043, *inter alia*, terminating Superior Court Administrative Order No. 2021-105, regarding Municipal Court pandemic-related operations and procedures.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, that consistent with Arizona Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 2022-34 and Superior Court Administrative Order No. 2022-043, the Glendale City Court shall resume normal operations forthwith.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Glendale City Court Administrative Order No. 2022-014 Amending Administrative Order 2022-013 is rescinded.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all COVID pandemic related mandatory practices and procedures heretofore implemented in this Court are rescinded.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that to promote speedy trials and other dispositions of pending cases, and to assist in the recovery from delays occasioned during the pandemic, defendants shall be required to be present on all court dates, unless good cause is shown and the Court so orders.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Court shall implement vertical case management. To increase efficiency, through consistency and accountability, cases shall be assigned to an individual judge after arraignment and remain the responsibility of that judge until final disposition.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this order shall be effective April 15, 2022.
