

Items must be ready for collection no later than Monday at 6 a.m. the week of your collection.

Residents may place bulk trash out no earlier than the Thursday before your scheduled service week (ex: Thursday, September 29 for Monday, October 3) and no later than 6 a.m. the Monday of your scheduled service.

It is a violation of city ordinance to put bulk trash out before or after the assigned period.

Residents not placing bulk trash out on time will not receive service until the following month and are required to remove their items from the street or alley until the next scheduled service. Failure to comply may result in enforcement action, including charges to the resident.

\$2 Per Month Optional Gift on Your Water Bill Helps Our Most Vulnerable Citizens

Every month, when we pay our water bill, either in the mail or online, that little box stands out that asks if you would like to donate \$2 to From the Heart. I hope that you will consider checking that box “yes” each month because it goes a long way towards helping our city’s most vulnerable citizens.

To clear up a misconception, this program is not simply a utility payment subsidy. Whether serving meals to the elderly, giving emergency help to homeless families or supporting abused children, From the Heart gives agencies that provide services to our neighbors a helping hand in many ways. Currently about 13% of households participate in the program, which provides \$75,000 to \$150,000 in grants annually. From The Heart’s mission is to promote the positive development of youth, strengthen the capabilities of families and assist residents in addressing crisis needs by supplementing the resources of existing community agencies.
