- **July 29: First day early ballots will be mailed**
- **August 13: Last day to request early ballot by mail or telephone**
- **August 24: Primary Election Day**

2010 Household Hazardous Waste Pickup

Dispose of unwanted household hazardous waste products by scheduling an at-home pickup between September 27 and October 22. The actual collections will be handled October 18 through November 5. Call the Sanitation Division at 623-930-2660 to make your appointment.

Hazardous materials that will be accepted include paints and wood stains, antifreeze and other automotive fluids, motor oil and filters, car batteries, pesticides, pool chemicals and household cleaners. Items that are unacceptable are explosives, radioactive materials, tires, drums, ammunition and medical or business wastes.

There is a 20-gallon limit on paint, oil, gasoline, antifreeze and other automotive liquids. No single container may be larger than 5 gallons. All items should be in their original containers and must be clearly marked to identify their contents. For complete details, visit glendaleaz.com/sanitation and click on "hazardous materials."

As we celebrate Glendale's Centennial, I want to draw attention to one of our most historically significant landmarks, Thunderbird Field. Thunderbird Field was constructed in 1941 to train American, British, Canadian and Chinese pilots during WWII.

After the war ended and pilot training moved to Luke AFB, The American Institute of Foreign Trade was created on the site of the former military field. That early vision of global educational opportunity is now The Thunderbird School of Global Management, highly acclaimed as the top international business school in the world.

A key feature of the Thunderbird campus has always been the original Thunderbird Field air traffic control tower, which was the central hub of activity until it was closed in 2006 due to structural damage. A student-led campaign

to restore the tower is now underway. Because this project presents such a remarkable historic preservation opportunity, I have initiated a community campaign to help raise the remaining construction funds.

I invite you to share in the efforts to restore this Glendale landmark. Donations in any amount are appreciated. Park Renovations have Long-Term Benefits

Glendale is making improvements to several of its popular parks and trails, including Sahuaro Ranch Regional Park, Thunderbird Conservation Park and the Marshall Ranch Trail. These renovations will add to Glendale's growing list of amenities, focusing on lasting improvements for residents.



Enhancements include the addition of two full size multi-use fields, new shade structures, improved ADA accessibility and 'green' lighting installation at Sahuaro Ranch Regional Park and paved parking lots at Thunderbird Conservation Park. Marshall Ranch Trail improvements include creating a new trail surface for pedestrians and bicycle users, which connects the Thunderbird Paseo Linear Park to the historic Sun Circle Trail.
