“Glendale’s Memory Project” Launches Sept. 10 on Glendale 11 TV

Glendale, Ariz. – A photo captures a moment in time – and hundreds of historical photos of Glendale have been assembled for the Internet and for a television documentary to share part of Glendale’s history with citizens, students and researchers.

In honor of the city’s centennial in 2010, Glendale Public Library joined with Glendale Historical Society, Glendale Community College, Sahuaro Ranch Park Historic Area and Thunderbird School of Global Management to bring collections of old photographs from the city’s past to life online and on TV.

The 30-minute TV show, ‘Glendale’s Memory Project,’ gives an overview of how the massive project of placing the photos online by the five partners was carried out. Viewers learn the history of each of the partners and the process they went through to choose, scan and describe the photos, and some little known facts about special people and places in Glendale; and about the Arizona Memory Project, which houses the collections of 38 Arizona institutions.

“Glendale’s Memory Project” debuts on Thursday, Sept. 10 at 6:30 p.m. and can be seen during its regular time slot every Thursday at 6:30 p.m. as well as various times throughout the week on Glendale Channel 11.
