Glendale Water Services' "Not in My Drain!" Campaign Raises Awareness about Drain Blockages

Delicious meals bring families and friends together during the holidays but don't let a clogged drain spoil your plans this holiday season. Pouring fats, oils, and grease (FOG) down the kitchen drain can cause sewer clogs that block the flow of wastewater from your home to the city's wastewater treatment plant. This wastewater can then overflow into homes, yards, streets, and local waterways.

Glendale's Water Services Department leads a campaign called, "Not in My Drain!" which provides information for residents about the proper way to dispose of food waste so they can prevent costly sewer clogs and overflows. "Sometimes residents are unaware that when you pour gravy, cooking oil and grease down the drain, those items can solidify in the pipes, causing blockages," said Lee Robinson, Glendale's administrator of pretreatment programs. "We promote the 'Not in My Drain' campaign all year long, but we really emphasize it during the holidays when residents are cooking more."

Glendale Water Services Department recommends the following best practices to prevent sewer blockages:

- Pour used grease into a disposable container, sealing the lid and disposing in the trash can.
- Scrape food from dishes and cookware into the trash can prior to washing.
- Put strainers in sink drains to catch food scraps and dispose of them in the trash can.
- Don't flush baby wipes, disinfecting wipes, and paper towels because they do not break down quickly like toilet paper.



Open: 6 a.m. - 10 p.m.


This community park is 19 acres and features an aquatics center, open in the summer, and the Rose Lane Recreation Center.

St. Johns Lutheran Church West Valley Community Food Pantry

The West Valley Community Food Pantry is a non-profit emergency source of food. They have been serving families in their community for the past 24 years. In addition to food boxes, they also provide, at no charge, some clothing, household items and job assistance.

The food pantry is located on the campus of St. John's Lutheran Church at 7205 N. 51st. Avenue. They allow 5 $\,$

food boxes per year to each household. They have no boundaries but they do request a photo ID for the person picking up the food and identification for the other members of the household. (Acceptable ID: Driver's License, State ID, Birth Certificate, Mexican ID, AHCCCS card, Social Security card [only use last 4 digits])

Rose Lane Aquatics Center 5003 W. Marlette Ave. * 623-930-7905 (east of 51st Ave., north of Bethany Home Rd.)

This seasonal facility is only open to the public during the summer.

Activities include full facility aquatic rentals, seasonal private swim lessons, group swim lessons, and summer public recreation swimming. This facility includes a large, zero depth entry leisure pool with spray features, a splash pad, a giant slide, a kiddie slide, and a big pool with a diving well and a diving board. Rose Lane has outdoor "day use" lockers. Please bring your own lock or you may purchase one at the Rose Lane Cashier's Office. This facility is only staffed when the pools are open for aquatic programming.
