Planning Commission Holds Workshop To Move Forward On Scenic Corridor Along 101 Freeway. On Thursday, April 2nd, the Glendale Planning Commission will host a workshop to continue plans for the scenic corridor from 51st Avenue to Union Hills along the loop 101. The Glendale City Council gave direction to city staff, at the February 17 workshop, to proceed with implementing the corridor which is expected to be completed within 9 to 12 months. The Planning Commission Workshop on Thursday, April 2nd, will begin at 5 p.m. and will be held at the Glendale Council Chamber. The workshop will follow city workshop policies and procedures which prohibits public comment.

Cholla District Meeting, Wednesday April 8. Councilmember Lauren Tolmachoff is hosting a community meeting for residents living in the Cholla District at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, April 8 at Legend Springs Elementary School, 21150 N Arrowhead Loop Rd, Glendale, AZ 85308.

Councilmember Tolmachoff will focus her meeting on Public Safety, Glendale's Neighborhood Block Watch program, and street improvements. She will be joined by Glendale's Chief of Police Debora Black, Foothills Police Commander, Larry Castrovinci, and Glendale's Director of Public Works, Jack Friedline. In addition to providing updates on Cholla District and citywide news, Glendale representatives will be available to answer questions from residents.

2015 Shred Event. The Glendale Police Department and Councilmember Tolmachoff will host a Shred Event on April 11th, 2015. This free service is a valuable resource that helps residents properly dispose of personal information that can lead to identity theft. The Shred Event on April 11th will be open to the public from 8-11 AM and will take place at Highland Lakes School located at 19000 N. 63rd Ave Glendale, AZ 85308, just north of 63rd Ave and Union Hills. Each household is limited to three banker's boxes and due to demand, the event may conclude if trucks are full. Recent Changes to Sky Harbor Flight Paths. On September 18, 2014 the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) implemented changes in flight paths to and from Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport as part of its effort to streamline departures and arrivals using satellite-based navigation. Since then, Phoenix Sky Harbor and the Federal Aviation Administration have received questions and complaints about the changes.

The city of Glendale Airport held a public meeting to discuss the recent changes to the Phoenix Sky Harbor Airport flight paths. The meeting was held on March 4, 2015 where Representatives from city of Glendale presented information and discussed how the changes may affect Glendale residents. Representatives from the cities of Glendale and Phoenix held a question and answer session following the presentation.

Funding Available for Performing Arts Projects. To motivate, increase and support the performing arts in Glendale, the city's Public Art Program is offering up to \$4,000 per project in support funding for theater, dance, music and interdisciplinary performing arts activities and performances to be held in the city of Glendale.

The program is designed to offer aid for projects open and free to the Glendale community and may be used to support items such as artist fees, project-related expenses for producing performances and workshops and project-related expenses for cultural exchanges that result in performances. All activities must take place within the city limits of Glendale.

Applicants must be located in or co-sponsor with an organization, school or government agency domiciled within the city limits of Glendale. Applicants must be a 501(c)3 tax exempt nonprofit organization. Applicants without this status may apply through a 501(c)3 organization, school, or government agency. Examples of co-sponsoring organizations: City of Glendale Office of Special Events, Parks & Recreation, Public Libraries or any school or college located within the city limits of Glendale.
