Volunteers Needed For Glendale Trail Clean Up. The City of Glendale is recruiting volunteers to join in the global effort to improve communities while making the world cleaner and more sustainable. In recognition of Earth Day, and in partnership with the city of Peoria and Arizona Clean and Beautiful, the city of Glendale is seeking volunteers to attend the Party for the Planet on Saturday, April 18. Volunteers will help pick up trash and debris along the New River and Skunk Creek trail systems.

"Our parks, our trails, our bike paths, our natural environment is where we all meet and live. It is where we make memories and become communities. It only makes sense that we take care of these beautiful outdoor resources," said Glendale's Neighborhood Services Coordinator, Michelle Yates. Hundreds of volunteers are needed to help with the river and trail clean up. Volunteers will need to dress in layers, bring gloves and wear sunscreen. Tennis shoes or closed-toed shoes are required. Garbage bags will be provided along with water. Families are encouraged to participate.

Home Repair Program Funds Available To Glendale Residents. With the arrival of spring, many make this the time of year to take on home repair projects. The City of Glendale's Community Revitalization Division reminds residents about the city's Single Family Rehabilitation Program. This program provides Glendale's single family residents with a chance to get financial assistance for housing

rehabilitation, roof repairs, emergency repairs and exterior improvements.

Through a variety of federal grants such as Community Development Block Grants (CDBG), the City of Glendale offers this program to assist low to moderate income homeowners to make the needed improvements to their homes with financial assistance to absorb the immediate cost of the repair.

“There is never an opportune time for a costly repair to a roof or the exterior of the home but right now the City of Glendale is taking applications and we are able to help homeowners with these overwhelming projects by providing a deferred loan to cover the portion a homeowner’s insurance does not cover,” explains Glendale’s Community Revitalization Department Supervisor, Charyn Eirich- Palmisano.

Through an application process, low to moderate income homeowners can apply for the funds to repair unsafe or deteriorating conditions. The property must be within Glendale city limits and must be owner-occupied for at least one year. Proof of homeowner’s insurance is required.
