Glendale Fire Urges All Residents To Know How Old Their Smoke Alarms Are, And To Replace Them Every 10 Years. To find out how old your smoke alarm is and its expiration date, look on the back of the alarm where the date of manufacture is marked. The smoke alarm should be replaced ten years from that date (not the date of purchase). The Glendale Fire Department also says smoke alarms should be tested monthly, and that batteries should be replaced once a year or when they begin to chirp, signaling that they're running low.
